



## WORKERS' COMPENSATION TIMELINE



### 1800s Global Origins

- Workers' compensation concepts emerge in Germany, Great Britain, and the United States
- **1880**: The Employers' Liability Act in Great Britain was introduced
- 1886: The Workmen's Compensation for Injuries Act of Ontario was introduced



#### 1900-1919 Foundations

- 1910-1913: Meredith's review leads to Meredith Report
- 1914-1918: Ontario, Nova
   Scotia, Manitoba, British
   Columbia, Yukon, Alberta,
   & New Brunswick all created
   Workers' Compensation Boards
- 1919: AWCBC founded; first convention in BC



### 1920-1979

#### Expansion

- Quebec, Saskatchewan, PEI, Newfoundland, Yukon, NWT join AWCBC
- 1928: Quebec Workmen's Compensation Commission was created
- 1970s: Titles begin changing from "Workmen's" to "Workers' Compensation



#### 1980-1999


#### Reform

- 1985: Quebec's Act respecting industrial accidents and diseases modernized laws
- 1988: Annual Workers' Compensation College launched
- 1996: AWCBC took over National Work Injury Statistics Program
- 1998-1999: Ontario became WSIB; Nunavut shared board with NWT





## WORKERS' COMPENSATION TIMELINE



#### 2000-2017

#### Modernization

- Public forums and board rebrand: WorkSafeBC, WorkSafeNB, WorkplaceNL
- 2008: NWT and Nunavut Workers' Compensation Board renamed Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission
- 2013: Centennial celebration of the Meredith Report
- 2016: Quebec creates CNESST, merges multiple agencies
- 2017-2018: BC, NS, Yukon, Alberta Boards celebrated 100 years



#### 2019 - Present

- 2019: AWCBC's 100th anniversary
- 2022: Yukon passes new Act; Board becomes WSCB
- 2023: Newfoundland and Labrador introduce new safety and OHS legislation
- 2024: AWCBC appoints new CEO, marking a significant milestone in the organization's leadership and vision for the future

# INFORMATION REQUEST SERVICE

Our centralized Information Request Service allows members to consult with one another on any business matter across all disciplines. Responses are compiled, shared with the requester, and stored in a national repository for future access by all members. In addition, members can search for past information requests by keyword, year, or category.

Whether you require a quick statistical comparison to other provinces and territories or a specific customized report, assistance with an event or committee meeting, or simply a forum for group discussion, the AWCBC is here to help you.





## NATIONAL WORK INJURY STATISTICS PROGRAM

The AWCBC manages the National Work Injury Statistics Program (NWISP), which gathers data on work-related, accepted Lost Time Claims, Diseases and Fatalities across 20 major industries and 10 major occupation groups. The accepted Lost Time Claims, Diseases and Fatalities are broken into 10 categories.

Each year, the AWCBC produces the National Work Injury, Disease and Fatality Statistics Publication, also known as the NWISP Publication, featuring the most recent available figures.


The annual NWISP Publication is posted on the AWCBC website. Also posted are publications from previous years. NWISP Summary Tables, the NWISP Year at a Glance, and Infographics are also publicly available through the AWCBC's website.

For tailored information, organizations and researchers may request customized statistical data by completing the online Customized NWISP Data Form.

### KEY STATISTICAL MEASURES

The AWCBC's Key Statistical Measures (KSM) report is your annual snapshot of Canada's workers' compensation landscape. This comprehensive report consolidates figures ranging from injury rates and claim payments to assessment rates, and administrative costs, offering a valuable resource for stakeholders across the system.

The KSM report is available on the AWCBC's website. The site provides customized reporting options, enabling you to generate and download reports tailored to your specific needs.
