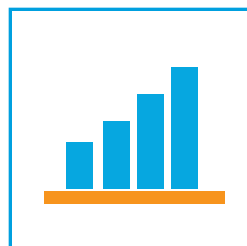

NATIONAL WORK INJURY STATISTICS PROGRAM

AWCBC's National Workplace Injury Statistics Program is the sole collector and provider of lost time work-related injuries, disease, and fatalities statistics across Canada.

The data is broken into 10 separate categories across 18 major industries. Shared on our website and through customized requests, the data is your go-to place for research, prevention of accidents and injuries, and to track national trends.

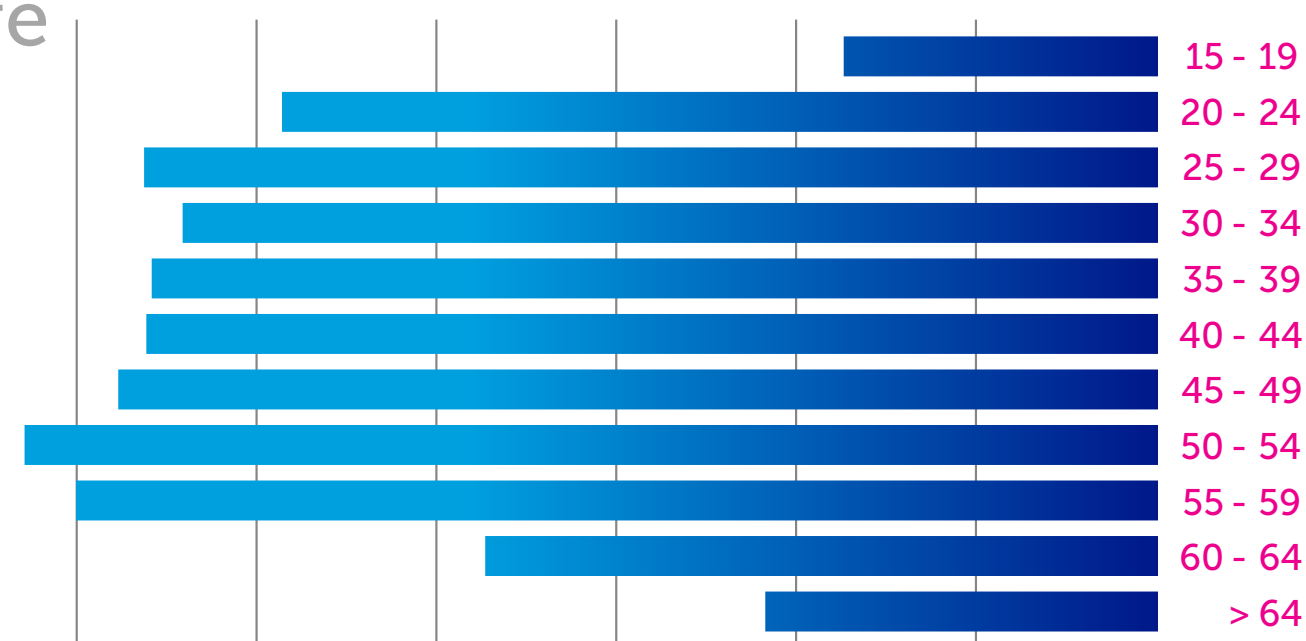


By Age

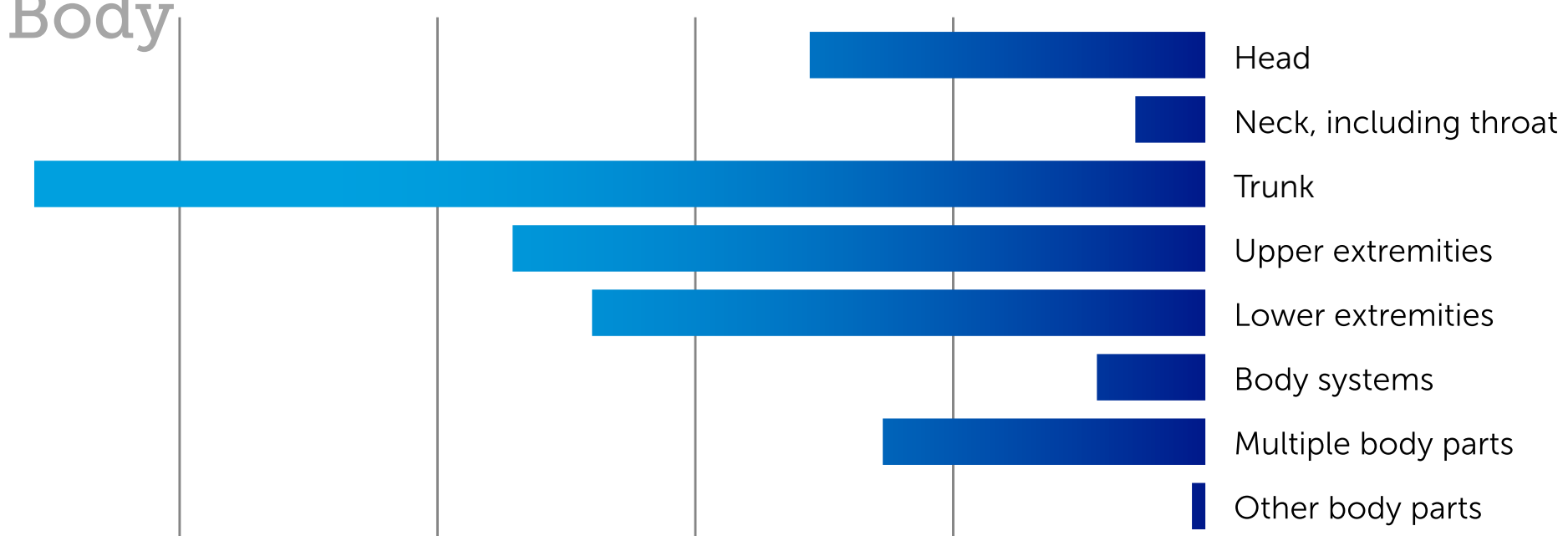

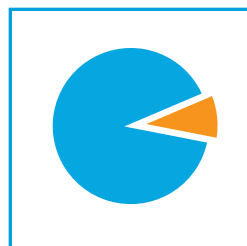
Lost Time Claims in Canada [↗](#)

KEY STATISTICAL MEASURES

AWCBC's Key Statistical Measures (KSM) comprise 6 categories and 17 subsections, detailing facts from Claims and Injury Frequency to Benefit Liabilities and Administration Costs.

The KSM reports such as the popular "Year at a Glance" feature common definitions for financial and statistical indicators that provide detailed facts and quick snapshots of the differences between jurisdictions.

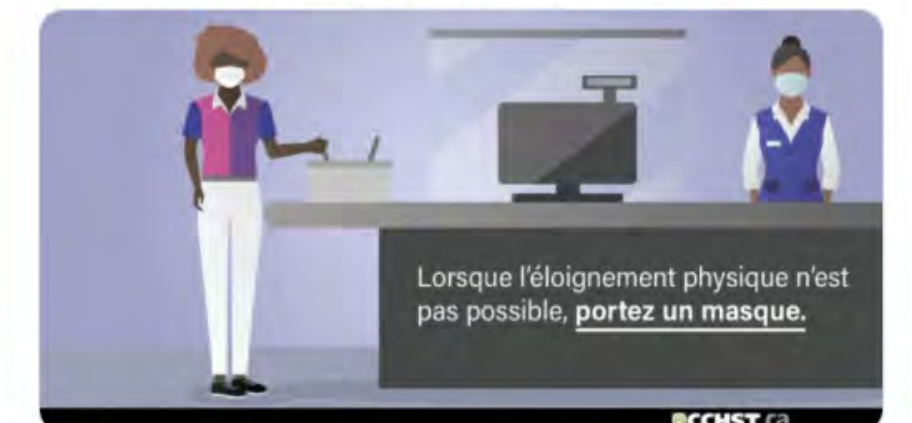

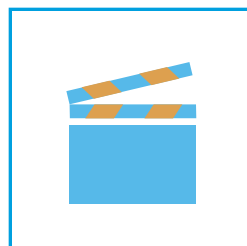

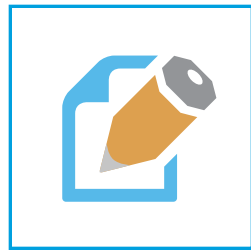
